
Michael and wife Margaret owned and ran the bakery and shop for 50 years, closing the doors in 2007



Did you ever take the train from MONKS CROSS?



A brief history of Luckett Station.



Established on 7th May 1872 as a 3 foot 6 inch narrow gauge railway depot called 'Monks Corner' the line was 7.5 miles long running from Kelly Bray to Calstock and used to transport minerals and bricks, stone and coal from the many local mines and quarries.

In the following years many changes and modifications were made to the line that would eventually re-open as The Tamar Valley line including the construction of Luckett Station buildings by the celebrated light rail engineer Colonel Stephens and the construction of the impressive Calstock Viaduct by John Lang of Liskeard (started in 1904 and completed in 1907) it's an impressive sight still and is unique, being the largest viaduct in the UK built from concrete blocks.

In 1908 it was operating as a passenger and goods station serving the Tamar Valley. Luckett Station boasted its own carriage shed and amongst many things handled parcels, livestock, cattle vans and horse boxes. The original goods and passenger platforms are still in place together with the original granite railway bridge.

The goods side of the station was closed in September 1962 and, as part of the infamous 'Beeching cuts', the station was closed to passengers on 5th November 1966.



New owners have created two beautiful and unique holiday cabins 'The Signal Box' and 'The Sidings' which run independently of each other due to the layout and size of the station grounds. We have been very lucky as both holiday cabins are amazingly successful with year round occupancy and our wonderful guests breathe life back into a station that was built to be of service to the public.

Located in The Waiting Room building sited on the original passenger platform at Old

Luckett Station is an indoor heated swimming pool available for hire, early till late, seven days a week, all year round. Gift vouchers are available. https://oldluckettstation.com/



RECIPE OF THE MONTH Mexican Gazpacho

This chilled soup makes for a lovely light starter for a summer meal. Make sure your produce is as fresh as possible as there is no cooking involved and you want the flavours to sing. Serves 4

Ingredients

- 600g vine-ripened tomatoes
- Small cucumber (about 4 inches)
- 1 red pepper
- 1 teaspoon smoky paprika
- 500ml water
- 2 birdseye chillies (optional)
- · Splash olive oil
- Splash vinegar
- Salt and pepper, to season
- Coriander, to garnish (spicy croutons good too)



Method

- 1. Place tomatoes, cucumber, pepper, paprika, water and chillies into a food processor or blender, and blend until smooth.
- 2. Pour into a jug and stir in the olive oil, vinegar and add seasoning to taste.
- 3. Chill in a refrigerator for at least 1 hour.
- 4. Serve with fresh coriander as a garnish.

(A good way to use up surplus tomatoes and cucumbers in season. Also works substituting a small courgette for the cucumber, but make sure it is really well blended.

This month's adventure for the WI was a trip across from Plymouth to Drake's Island where they had a guided tour around the island.



Honey Fair plans are well & truly buzzing.




Saturday 30th September

South Hill Parish Council

Details of the meeting held on 18th July 2023 included the following topics:

Soil and waste deliveries to Tregonnett Farm, Golberdon

Several people have contacted the council or councillors about this. One resident attended the meeting in person to express their concerns about the volume of lorry traffic and asked questions about the type of material and licencing. They wanted to know how long these deliveries would continue and if the material might be moved back out of the parish. The Parish Council had been given answers to some of these questions. However, the Council has no statutory role in this matter so decided the best course of action was to support a public statement directly from Mr Marquand, the farmer at Tregonnett. He has said he is happy to talk to anyone who contacts him individually. 07777 254 7339

Play Area

The Play Area is inspected weekly by the Council. If you notice anything, between inspections, that is damaged or appears to be faulty, please let the Council know about it.

Affordable Housing

The Council has no issues with the content of the Housing Needs Survey. It can now be published on the Council website. Jonathan Pollard, Housing Development Officer at Cornwall Council will now look at the survey results and produce some proposals which will be the basis for further discussion with the parish.

Good growth Fund

Cornwall Council has been awarded £132M from the Governments Shared Prosperity Fund. There is more about the Good Growth Fund here https://ciosgoodgrowth.com/

There are 2 grants available to help local organisations.

The <u>Community Capacity Fund</u> is intended to support community organisations to develop projects or project ideas. It's fairly straightforward to get started with a new venture. The Project Team are there to help applicants.

The <u>Community Levelling Up Programme</u> is there to support a range of community projects. Larger grants are available but there is much more demand so if you are part of an organisation that might benefit, you would be wise to apply soon.

Granite Trough

The saga continues but a solution is in sight! It can be recessed into the bank so that it conforms to the current road safety requirements. The bank near to Lamberts Well (the well not the house!) is lower than at the original site of the trough so the stability of the bank won't be an issue



Church Matters August 2023

Faith and Trust: I've been enjoying a biography on the life of Abraham, written by David Jackman. Abraham was getting on in years when he was first upped sticks and left the security of his home in Haran (possibly in modern Turkey). He left it all to go to the land of Canaan with his family and nephew Lot. He didn't have an easy life nor was he perfect, yet he is known for believing that, not only did God exist, but that such a being was calling him to go on such an adventure.

As a person, Abraham is both colourful and inspiring for those about to embark on a spiritual journey. He had to search his soul and face his shortcomings. His encounters with God enlarged his understanding of who this all-knowing, all-powerful being was. This faith is something deeper than mere head-knowledge or about having feelings of something 'other' or spiritual.

Blondin (Jean-Francois Gravelet), was a well-known acrobat and tightrope walker in the 1800s. He's famous for crossing Niagra Falls on a tightrope. Large crowds watched him cross using a balancing pole. He would then throw the pole away to the amazement of his onlookers. In 1860, watched by a Royal party from England, he crossed the tightrope on stilts and then did so wearing a blindfold. Later, he stopped halfway to cook an omelette, which he sat and ate. Next, he pushed a wheelbarrow across and then added a sack of potatoes.

He asked the Duke of Newcastle, 'Do you believe that I could take a man across the tightrope in this wheelbarrow?" Yes I do,' said the Duke. 'Hop in!' replied Blondin. The crowd hushed, but sadly the Duke of Newcastle refused to accept this challenge. Asking for a volunteer, an old woman stepped forwards and got into the wheelbarrow. He pushed her all the way across and back again. The old woman turned out to be Blondin's mother, the only person willing to put her life in his hands.



The people watching believed Blondin could perform such a feat. But none of them, apart from his mother, was willing to put their trust in him. This is the same with faith which is not merely intellectual; it involves an active step of putting our trust in God. Yes, this involves risk, but the journey of faith proves to be is exhilarating. Of course, we wouldn't put faith in our brakes if we knew they were faulty. Also, faith is not something we do from afar. We don't act like the concerned father (David Jackman talks about in his book), who said to his son:

Don't go into the water until you've learnt to swim!

This is a nonsense – you can only learn to swim if you actually venture into the water; at first with buoyancy aids and maybe an instructor. Similarly, faith and trust in God requires that we step out into the unknown and allow God to carry us across the chasm that exists between people and the kingdom of God. We can trust entirely in God because he delivers on his promises.
