



It's APPLE SEASON!

This month, two apple recipes...one for the experienced cook, the other for the rest of us!

APPLE STRUDEL

Pastry	200g plain flour
	50g margarine

Filling	400g apples, peeled and chopped
	1 tbsps sultanas
	1 tbsps currants
	1 desert spoon mixed peel
	4 tbsps Demerara sugar
	1/4 level tspn ground cloves
	1 level tspn ground cinnamon
	1 level tspn grated nutmeg
	2 tbsps breadcrumbs, toasted
	62g butter/margarine
	2 / 2

Method

Rub margarine into flour to fine consistency. Add water to make pastry. Wrap in a clean tea towel and leave to rest for 30 minutes.

Mix fruit, sugar and spices together in a bowl. Roll out pastry very thinly on floured tea towel or baking parchment, gently stretch to make as thin as possible without breaking the pastry. When almost transparent, brush with the melted butter/margarine, sprinkle with the toasted breadcrumbs, spread the rest of the ingredients on the pastry evenly, keeping it well in from the edges.

With the tea towel/baking parchment roll it up evenly like a Swiss roll and seal the edges. Transfer to a baking tray, brush with melted butter/margarine, and slash top with a knife.

Put in a hot oven 200°C (400°F, gas mark 6) for about 30 minutes until cooked. Remove from oven and sprinkle with sifted icing sugar. Serve hot with ice cream.

APPPLE SCONE ROUND

Ingredients	8 oz plain flour 1/2 tsp salt 2 tsp baking powder	Si Ri gr
	 2 oz margarine or butter 1 oz sugar 1 medium size cooking apple, peeled and coarsely grated A little milk 	st ar in Br ov br

Method

Sieve together the flour, salt and baking powder. Rub in the butter or margarine. Add the sugar and grated apple, and enough milk to give a soft, but not sticky, dough. Turn onto a floured board. Roll into an 8-inch circle. Place onto a baking tray and score into 8 pieces.

Brush a little milk over the top and bake in a hot oven 210°- 220°C until well risen and golden brown. Serve warm with butter.

Living Churchyard

St Sampson's continues to discover more species growing in the churchyard and a recent visit from lichen expert Bob Hodgson 7th August recorded over 40 varieties.

We want to add **more benches** in the churchyard, so people can sit and enjoy the space. If you would like to sponsor a bench or part bench, please contact me <u>judithayers@yahoo.co.uk</u>. We are aiming to use benches made from recycled plastic (approx. \pounds 250) which are environmentally friendly, maintenance free and last 5 times longer than timber. Perhaps you would like a bench in memory of a loved one.

Please can I gently remind anyone putting **flowers on graves**, that they should not be plastic. This is because the plastic gets brittle and broken and then small pieces are scattered in the grass, making it very difficult to remove and become a hazard to wildlife. St Sampson's is proud of being an eco church and we strive to be environmentally friendly in all that we do, whilst creating a peaceful and beautiful haven for our loved ones no longer with us, for those visiting graves and our wildlife residents.

The fence on the **East boundary** has been replaced by the Community Payback team and they are in the process of painting the gate.

We hope to put up more **bird boxes** this autumn and create an information board with many of the plants and animals that have found a home in the churchyard. More on this next month.

Please visit and enjoy the church and churchyard. **Explorer packs** are available in the porch for families and children.

We would like to make the **church porch** more welcoming. We welcome our wildlife in the form of jackdaws, pigeons, and night roosting bats, but their activity takes its toll! It needs a good clean, the flaking paint scraped off and re painted. Is there anyone who would like to volunteer to take on this task. We will supply the paint and sustenance in the form of pasties, coffee and cake.

The 2023 SHARE AGM on 22nd September attracted a larger proportion of the membership than usual, and a few non-members who wished to comment. This was due to the inclusion of the motion to purchase land for use as a Community-owned space.

The Directors were disappointed that this motion was not carried, as we have consumed valuable time and some of our reserves on legal fees. We would therefore welcome suggestions from our members on what other type of projects we should pursue in the future.

The remaining business of the AGM was conducted in the usual way, the directors re-elected, the accounts accepted and the profits allocated to general reserves for future use.

As Autumn goes on and the weather gets colder, don't forget that SHARE has a **thermal imaging camera available to borrow**, which could show you where your home is losing heat, so that you can make changes to save energy. SHARE RECYCLING FOR CHARITY project update.

The majority of the items we collect, are sent to Terracycle to be processed, points are awarded for our shipments, which can be redeemed every 6 months, April and October.

We have just added £1210 to our total which will be sent direct to Kicks Count our main charity.

We also have an **extra bonus of £500** from sending BROKEN toys, games and puzzles to be recycled, since May. THIS PROGRAMME HAS NOW BEEN PUT ON HOLD.

People have given us many many toys in good condition, and we have given lots away at our popular **TOY SWAPS** over the last 2 month in Callington, Liskeard, Launceston, Saltash, Tavistock and most recently at Upton Cross on Sept. 21st. And we've given away some soft toys to nursing homes, The Ukraine Appeal, Teddy Trust via Stoke Climsland church, Grow Baby Launceston, Baby Basics Liskeard and Launceston Cat Protection League.

PLUS we have sold some to raise money for local charities and good causes and we will continue to do this.

We are now accepting **JIGSAWS** in good condition for Budehaven Special School.

Starting now until February 9th 2024 we will be collecting **all plastic bottle tops, sweet tubs, ice cream tubs, takeaway tubs and plastic food containers with the PP5 symbol.** These will be sent to Devon Contact Waste to be made into picnic benches and raise money for their charities which includes Dartmoor Zoo.

We have room for a few more people to monitor collection points, pick up, box up, record and promote via events. This would be ideal for students working on their Duke of Edinburgh awards or similar and people with some time to help on a regular monthly basis.

Following the trip to the **Cornwall Energy Recovery Centre**, on August 24th when 18 of us saw the incinerator process in full action, we are keen to visit other sites as well. Details will be on our web page and FB group.

Saving the Planet:

It seems just recently that barely a day goes by without some reference to pollution, loss of biodiversity or global warming. Global warming has been referred to repeatedly as the ultimate cause of the increasing number of extreme weather conditions and their disastrous effects on nature and communities. **The planet needs saving.**

Many would take the position that science and technology will 'save the day' and restore the environmental imbalances. Science may or may not provide the tools required, but is there the political will globally to take the action required, especially when that may involve considerable sacrifices? An eminent environmental layer who I have quoted before has this to say on the question:

"I used to think that top environmental problems were biodiversity loss, ecosystem collapse and climate change. I thought that thirty years of good science could address these problems. I was wrong. The top environmental problems are selfishness, greed and apathy, and to deal with these we need a cultural and spiritual transformation. And we scientists don't know how to do that." (Gus Speth, author and U.S. advisor on climate change)

And now for the Good News and there is Good News.

Firstly, much is being done already by both individuals, companies and nations to begin to restore the imbalances in our environment. It is all too easy to think that anything we do as individuals will be insignificant on a global scale but every little helps.

If enough of us 'do our bit' it can add up to a significant contribution nationally or even globally. Two of the churches in the area (St Sampson's South Hill and just recently St Paul's Upton Cross) have received a silver Eco Church award from 'A Rocha' for their small contribution. (<u>https://arocha.org.uk</u>)

Secondly there is Good News of a much more significant nature, the promise of that 'cultural and spiritual transformation' spoken of by Gus Speth.

The promise is the great theme of the Bible and at the core of this 'Good News' is the Messiah promised to the Jews and known to Christians as Jesus. This 'cultural and spiritual transformation' starts on an individual basis as spoken of by John Gaul in last month's 'Church Matters' about Salvation. The promise is that those transformed (saved) individuals will have a role in saving (transforming) the planet, both now and in the future, under the direction of the Messiah, Jesus.

This transformation will result in the planet and its people becoming all that they could be, should be, all that God intended them to be. Sin, a sometimes-misunderstood Christian technical term, simply means failing to be that.

Falling short of all that could be; falling short of all that God intended. There is a vision described in the Bible of nations being at peace with each other and all life flourishing as it has never flourished before. Now there's Good News. I'm in – are you?

Bray Shop Community Speed Watch group.

First, I'd like to thank all of the volunteers of our group who devote their time to monitor the speed of traffic passing through our village.

Since we started last year, our group has volunteered 408 hours of their time.

We record the speed of traffic with a Police sanctioned radar gun and any vehicle travelling in excess of the speed limit is reported to the Police.

No fine is issued, but **warning letters are sent by the Police to the registered vehicle owner**.

We also spot vehicles that have **no tax or MOT**, and these vehicles are reported to the **DVLA for further action**.

For those interested in the speeds of some of these vehicles, we have seen 4 vehicles travelling **in excess of 50 mph and numerous vehicles over 40mph.**

However, we are seeing an overall reduction in the percentage of vehicles speeding since we started the scheme last year.

Thank you again to the 12 volunteers in Bray Shop Community Speed Watch group.

Their presence is having a positive impact on slowing traffic to the correct speed limit.

We are running another speed check campaign next week. All the locations where we record the speed of traffic have been strictly reviewed and sanctioned by the Police.

South Hill Parish Council meeting

Details of the meeting held on 19 September 2023 include the following topics:

HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY: The results of the survey are now available online to all at: <u>https://www.cornwall.gov.uk/housing/affordable-housing/housing-needs-surveys-and-reports/</u> The council will now write to Mr Johnathan Pollard, Cornwall Council, asking his advice regarding the next step to meet the parish's housing needs.

COUNCIL MEMBER: Carol Samuel has resigned as a member of the council. Arrangements will be made to elect a new councillor.

WEBSITE: It was agreed to fund amendments to the Parish Council Website to achieve website access ability requirements and to make the climate action group reports available.

GRANITE TROUGH:

The council has agreed previously that the trough should be placed on the opposite side of the road, on the triangle of land opposite Lamberts Well, just below Westmoors House. Arrangements were made to achieve this.

THE COMMUNITY ORCHARD: SHARE has cut the grass in the orchard plus the new allotments have been strimmed with black polythene sheet placed over them to restrict growth.

Allotments are still available should anyone want one.



PLAY AREA: A small amount of maintenance was agreed, with posts needing replacement and some wood equipment repainting.

RECREATIONAL FIELD: Attempts will be made to streamline the booking of the field and coordinate it with hall bookings when required. The football club has requested a storage shed similar to the cricket club.
