

On October 18th we went to Fowey Valley Cidery and Distillery in Lostwithiel. We had a interesting talk about cider apples, cider making and distilling. The cidery buys excess windfall apples from any source so nothing gets wasted. They distill the fermented apple juice to make apple brandy and gin. We tried all of these as well as some delicious apple juice and ciders. All this was followed by a pub lunch at Lanlivery.

# Walnut dreams

#### Ingredients

6oz icing sugar • 4oz butter or margarine • 2oz porridge oats • 2oz desiccated coconut • 1 heaped tsp. instant coffee dissolved/ or camp coffee • Walnut halves • Good quality chocolate with at least 70% cocoa – dark is best (milk chocolate can be used if preferred) Method

- 1. Cream together the margarine and icing sugar.
- 2. Add oats, coconut and coffee.
- 3. Mix well until soft.
- 4. Roll into small balls and set aside in a fridge or cold place to set.
- 5. Once set, dip each into melted chocolate.
- 6. Top with a walnut and leave to set.

The sweets will keep for approximately 2 weeks in the fridge. This recipe makes approximately 24 to 30, depending on the size of the treat you make. (Recipe from Kitchen Wisdom Celebrating 100 Years of Warwickshire WI).

#### St Sampson's Unlocked update

By the time you read this our full faculty (Church planning permission) should have been granted. This has taken a long time, nearly 18 months to secure. With St Sampson's being a listed building and a church, many people and organisations have a say in what we can and cannot do! Our plans of restored and mended roof and ceiling, the Manaton Chapel renovated to be a bespoke warm, dry space for multiple uses and new kitchenette and toilet are now firmed up and the original plans amended, to try to please all parties concerned who must agree to the proposals. These include the Truro Diocesan Advisory Committee, Heritage England, Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings, Victorian Society, Natural England (bats) not forgetting the community who actually use the church and others.

There has been much toing and froing, in response to various objections between these organisations and us, together with our wonderful architect who has helped us wade through the treacle of the process and often seemingly impractical suggested solutions from some organisations. We have had to do much justifying of what we are planning, in the form of options appraisals, reports from experts and evidence of need and evidence of not changing the character of the church building. So, in the new year, with our permissions in place, we will be kick starting the funding campaign again.

The works will be done in phases as funds are secured approx. £300,000. Plans are available to view at the back of church under the St Sampson's unlocked board (amendments are not included in this original printed plan, please ask if you want to know more). This is a very exciting next step in our vision to make the church building a comfortable place for the community to use.

Along side this, our desire and plans for new overhead heaters are also taking shape and faculty permissions should have been granted by December enabling us to proceed fairly quickly. We have applied for help with a contribution towards the funding of the approx. £7000 costs, from the local Treffinick Solar Fund. The heaters will be more efficient in terms of energy use and the heat they give out. Welcome news indeed! We also have some heated seat cushions to use and may get more if they are deemed successful. These are very low energy use, so hit the button for us as an eco-church and for South Hill, who as a community, we know are very eco minded.

# **RECYCLING FOR CHARITY project.**

We can no longer accept sweet and chocolate wrappers Nestles the sponsor has told TerraCycle their "packaging is undergoing changes". Maybe more paper and cardboard? Less plastic!

**In the new year** our council rubbish/waste collections will be limited to a 180 litre wheelie bin once a fortnight, not unlimited weekly as it is now. A weekly food waste collection will be introduced, everything else will be fortnightly and should be recycled....

Black box: Glass jars and bottles, perfume bottles. No Pyrex or cookware, drinking glasses, sheet glass, all broken glass should be contained and put in general waste.
Orange bag: cardboard, greeting cards, wrapping paper, brown paper bags. No drinks cartons Blue bag: newspapers, magazines, brochures, junk mail, white envelopes
Red bag: plastic bottles, food trays, yoghurt pots, food tins, aerosols, deodorants, No black plastic, plastic bags.

It will be important we recycle more and not fill up our rubbish/waste wheelie bin.

**Recycling for Charity** accept flattened drinks cans, old clothes, clean rags, sheets, towels Empty crisps, biscuits, crackers, cake, cheese, bread packets/bags. Pringles brand tubes Old toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, lotion, gels, cream tubes, lipsticks, mascara, compacts Dishwasher, cleaning wipes packets, trigger sprays and hand dispenser pumps Plastic takeaway food containers, reusable rigid plastic bottles, Tupperware Take to Green Meadows, 200 metres from Golberdon crossroads on the South Hill Road.

#### **Recycling for Charity can not accept**:

- ANY toys and games, this is ON HOLD.
- NO Fruit or Veg bags, Fresh or Frozen
- NO Dried fruit slices packets
- NO Nets from Fruits or Garlic
- NO Sugar or Tea packets
- NO Sauce, Rice, Pasta, Noodles packets
- NO Shrink wrap, bubble wrap, cellophane, postal bags
- NO Cereals, granola, museli, oats packets
- NO Pet food, biscuits, treats anything pet
- **NO** Medicine Blister packets
- NO Yoghurt pot film lids or packaging



There are no manufacturers sponsoring these items. **Do not** leave these in our collection bins, the council do not recycle these either. Next month I'll list where some of these items can be recycled. But do not drop them to me. I can not take them.

# Christmas Pre-NUPs

Christmas, the song tells us, is 'the most wonderful time of the year'. In many ways that's true if you're one of those who, like me, really loves Christmas. It's a time to see old friends and family, to give and receive and to reflect on the significance of the birth of Christ.

It can be a stressful time especially if it involves bringing together relatives who you haven't seen for decades, who still treat you like a child. Victor Borg said that: "Santa Claus has the right idea. Visit people only once a year."

Then of course there's paying for it. One anonymous writer put it: Christmas is the season when you buy this year's gifts with next year's money. The expert on this is Martin Lewis, who said that

*`Christmas has become a retail festival and it shouldn't be. It should be joyous but it causes some people unhappiness, debt and worry'.* 

He went onto say that

'Many people feel obliged to buy gifts for others that they know they won't use, with money they don't have and cause themselves stress they don't need'.

Martin has some interesting perspectives on how we've disconnected from the real reasons for giving gifts and how it's led to the current treadmill of *tit-for-tat* giving. He suggests limiting gift-giving to close family and making a *Christmas pre-NUP* (<u>No Unnecessary Presents</u>) with others. I'm not advocating that we become Scrooge-like and fail to be generous, but Martin's suggestion sounds a very reasonable one.

The original message about giving at Christmas has its roots both in the Nativity and the first Santa Clause. The nativity speaks of the overwhelming generosity and love of God for all. The `*Message'* version of the Bible (John 3:16) puts it like this:

"This is how much God loved the world: He gave his Son, his one and only Son'. He did this not to condemn us, nor point his accusing finger at us but that we can have whole or full life. 'He came to help, to put the world right again'.

The original Santa Clause was St Nicholas, who was the Bishop of Myra. He was seriously concerned about helping the poor. One story tells of how he secretly dropped gold coins down the chimney of a poor family in order to prevent the occupier's three daughters from being sold into slavery. This mirrors the original Christmas story where God revealed kindness and love, not because of anything we deserved but because of God is love. God gave generously so we could be free. When we discover and experience the deep love of God reach down into our soul, we are moved to love others in need. The love of God so affected St Nicholas, that he was moved to help others in real need,

I'm hoping to get the balance right this Christmas and won't have a retail experience that causes me stress. I also hope we can all be inspired to love the poor as St Nicholas did.

# South Hill Parish Council meeting

Details of the meeting held on 19 November 2023 included the following topics:

#### **PARISH COUNCILLOR VACANCY:**

Following the resignation of Cllr Carol Samuel and there being insufficient demand for an election, the council will fill the vacancy by co-option at its meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> January or the next meeting following this date. Interested parties should apply in writing or by email. For further information about the role of Parish Councillor, and the co-option process please contact the Parish Clerk. Notices have been distributed for notice boards. Closing date for applications is Friday 12<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

#### **HEATING FOR ST SAMPSONS CHURCH:**

Mr David Young talked to the council about the ongoing scheme to improve heating in the church and submitted an application form for a grant from the Solar Fund. The plan is to purchase 12 suspended INFRA RED heating units to replace the current suspended old heating system in the church. The presented costs were: £4790 with a cost for installation of £1792. The council reviewed the qualifying criteria of grants from the solar fund taking into consideration the recent and planned use of the church for whole community events. After some discussion it was decided that this project did qualify for funding and to offer a 50% grant of the presented costs.

#### BUDGET FOR 2023/24 AND PRECEPT FOR 2024/25:

The current standing of the budget indicates that there is likely to be a short fall in income for the current financial year. When expected income and expenses were reviewed it is apparent that this is likely to carry forward to the 2024/2025 finances with no extra funds available. In the light of this review, it was decided to increase the precept currently at £9000 to £11,000 for the period 2024/2025.

**DOG BIN FOR BRAY SHOP:** The costs of a bin are: £300 for installation plus £ 340 for yearly emptying. In the light of the current financial climate it was decided that this cannot be afforded.

#### **FOOTPATHS:**

The council still await further responses from Cornwall Council regarding the suitability of a stile or gate at Woodlands. The council decided to replace the footpath sign at the start of path 638/20/1.

## **GOLBERDON** historic granite trough.



South Hill Parish Council have gone ahead and placed the granite trough, on the ground, by the lower, pedestrian entry to the recreation field. The trough was removed from the hedge near Lamberts Well by CORMAC when road works were carried out, and the parish council took on "ownership" of this parish asset. Following public site visits when options were discussed and with the landowner of the hedge where it was originally home for many years, our council have

now made their decision to site it.

There are no winter grit bins in the Parish, but the Parish Council do hold a supply of road salt for anyone that needs it.

#### This is available for use on the public highway and not for private use.

Please contact the parish clerk or one of the Councillors should you wish to spread some salt in bad weather conditions and delivery or collection can be arranged.


