
SOUTH HILL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY



QUICK AND EASY SUPPER FOR TIRED POST-CHRISTMAS COOKS!

SWEET CHILLI CHICKEN Serves 4

Ingredients

- 4 garlic cloves, crushed
- 110ml soy sauce
- 2 tbsps sweet chilli sauce
- 2 tbsps harissa powder
- 12 boneless & skinless chicken thighs. Salt and pepper Handful fresh chopped coriander

Method

Preheat oven to 200°C, (180° Fan), Gas Mark 6. Place all ingredients except the chicken and coriander into a small mixing bowl and mix well together. Pour the mixture over the chicken and toss to coat well. Place chicken on baking tray, season with salt and pepper, and cook in oven for 25 - 30 minutes, or until cooked. Sprinkle over the chopped coriander before serving. Goes well with either new potatoes or rice, and a green vegetable or salad.

Happy New year from St Sampson's Church and a round up of all that we have been doing in 2023.



A big personal thank you from me for your continued support to St Sampson's.

The church is daily open for visitors and there is a weekly service on Sunday, including forest café church every other month. This year we have had weddings, funerals, a baptism and a confirmation. A wassail in the community orchard and an outdoor thanksgiving service for our animals at Pennywort Mill and we run a weekly toddler group in the parish hall.

This year we are proud to have received our silver eco award. We may be small, but we are definitely thriving! St Sampson's Church is here for all the community and our restoration project progresses making it a more comfortable place for community events.

Lots has happened this year, so here is a brief roundup of our St Sampson's Unlocked project for 2023 and a reminder of previous SSU completed works.

- All thirteen of our windows including stonework have been restored and this project is now completed. Cost excl. VAT £46,432.00.
- The Michael Hill monument restoration is complete, and it is back in situ on the East wall in the Manaton Chapel. Cost excl. VAT £10,450.00
- External masonry repairs have been completed on the Manaton Chapel and around the West (tower door). Cost excl. VAT £8,796.00
- The porch stonework repairs are completed some new stone and pointing work. Cost £5,142.00
- West door and tower stair door restoration started in December. Cost excl VAT £6,500
- New overhead heaters installed December. Cost £7,000
- Full faculty approval final authorisation should be received any day now for roof, ceiling, toilet, kitchenette. The permission has taken us far longer than anticipated with much consultation between various parties. Tenders to be sought and then funding. The work will be done in phases.
- East wall external masonry repairs to be started in the new year.

Previous works

- Compost toilet installed in churchyard (2022)
- Roof valley gutter repair (2021)
- Removal and storage of bells and work to make bell frame safe (2021)
- Relocation of Font (2020)
- Installation of mains water supply (2020)
- External path lighting (2020)

Living Churchyard

- All bat boxes from the workshop in 2022 have been put up in the churchyard or surrounding properties.
- ➤ Nine Bird boxes put up in the churchyard for various species.
- > Wild Flower list compiled / wild flower talk and churchyard mini ramble.
- Lichen survey
- > Small mammals survey done with Cornwall small mammals group.
- > Moth survey.
- > End of year long grass cut and rake.
- Churchyard discovery packs created and there was a wonderful nature detective day with 48 children in August.
- 3 new benches to be purchased soon.

2023 Funding by: National Churches Trust, Cornish Historic Churches Trust, Listed Places of worship, Sabrina Sutherland Trust, Jill Franklin Trust, Local giving grants, National Grid Electricity Distribution, Ian M Foulerton Charitable Trust, Church Care, Rural Churches, Repair Fund, Lady Neville Charity, Trefinnick Solar Fund, Viscount Boyd Fund. Also individual donors and fund raising.

Our own fundraising has included: an inspirations evening, a baroque concert and a sea shanty gig, our medieval fair and barrow push, plant sales, and a stall at Callington Mayfest. We are hoping to have a big celebration and open day in the spring to celebrate our achievements.

Many thanks to all our funders big and small. This is an incredible achievement for a small rural parish and a very real way of serving South Hill community.

A New Year's Resolution

For many of us life is busy, even frantic at times, with jobs to be done, deadlines to meet and responsibilities we may have. It seems that the pace of life is faster than it has ever been – and in spite of all the labour saving devices we benefit from! It's all too easy to be so involved in what

we are doing that there is no opportunity to pause and reflect. To set time aside to slow down and ask ourselves why we are doing whatever it is that we are so busy with. A New Year is a good time to review and perhaps hit the reset button.



Increasingly we live in a 24/7 world. When I was growing up in the 50's and 60's I remember usually busy high streets being quiet and empty on a Sunday with everything except the occasional small shop closed. By contrast, today the high street on Sunday is as busy, if not busier, than any other day. This change is viewed as a change for the worse by some. It was certainly hotly debated when changes to Sunday trading laws were proposed, Many groups, both religious and non-religious, vociferously defended keeping the special status of the British Sunday. Setting aside the debate about Sunday trading law, the need for a sensible work/rest balance is generally accepted. Setting time aside for rest and regeneration is a necessary precaution to prevent burnout and maintain physical and mental wellbeing.

For many centuries the Jews have kept the Sabbath (our Saturday) as a special day when no work is carried out and families gather for a shared meal, worship and reflection. A principle laid down for ancient Israel about three thousand years ago in what we now call 'The Ten Commandments'. Millennia later there is an understanding of the rationale behind the instruction. Although it makes sound common sense now we may ponder how it was arrived at several thousand years ago.

Many Christians reserve Sunday for similar purposes and value the weekly opportunity this offers to take a break and recharge physical, mental and spiritual batteries. An opportunity to spend quality time with family or friends. An opportunity to pause and reflect on the past week and perhaps ponder some of the questions that business often denies us the time to consider: What are my priorities? What is really important to me? Why am I here?

It is not, however, always possible to reserve the same set day of the week for rest and reflection, especially if there are children in the family or work is an essential service like nursing or the Police.

Sometimes it is really difficult to carve out time to slow down for rest and reflection, However, not doing so carries a health warning, making us more vulnerable to stress and stress related disorders.

If it is not already part of your lifestyle, why not consider a New Year's resolution to make it so? Brian Norris

Details of the meeting held on 19th December 2023 included the following topics:

PLANNING

The application from National Grid Electricity Distribution was supported. Adding another wire to the existing poles will have very little visual impact and the increase in the capacity of the line will benefit all the consumers it serves.

FOOTPATHS

A new location for the signpost in Maders for footpath 638/20/1 has been agreed with a landowner and it will be installed soon.
