Our firewood project has had another successful season. Hopefully spring has arrived now and there won't be a need for firewood. There is plenty of firewood in stock for next winter.





Recycling Project

Those of you who follow Recycling for Charity will know by now that we collected an amazing 163kg of sweetie tubs (that's 3 large dumpy bags from Golberdon alone) after Christmas! Devon Contract Waste, who recycle the plastics, awarded us a recycled plastic bench which we will donate to a local school. Also we have a 15% discount on any purchase from their website.





Church Park Solar PV

Our 40kW array of solar panels on the agricultural building at Church Park was installed in 2016, financed by investments from our members. Next month we will be making the final capital and interest repayments after only 8 years, because the system has performed better than forecast. Thank you to all who invested and believed in our project.

South Hill Parish Hall Updates

Once again thanks to those who completed the recent hall survey. Your comments have been reviewed by the committee and feedback is shared below. Also please note that the **Hall AGM** is on **Tuesday 28 May 2024 at 7.30pm** in the main hall, all are welcome to attend.

Survey feedback

A lot of comments were received regarding the new lock so further explanation is warranted. The previous arrangement could not continue as our insurers required the key code to be changed after every use which was impractical. Consequently we took advice on appropriate alternatives before installing the new lock. The options were also constrained by new safety regulations which require that both: (a) anyone inside the hall can always exit without using a key, and (b) anyone outside with a key can always enter (so a lockable latch isn't allowed). A plug-in doorbell has been provided to allow non-keyholders to request entry, this can be turned on/off by simply switching the socket on/off. Please keep the door closed to help conserve heat in the hall.

New groups/events

The survey also provided a wide range of suggestions for new groups or events that could be run in the parish hall: dinners, concerts, film night, fitness night, fund raising, classic car show, ballroom dancing, badminton, skittles, barn dances, chess club, gardening club, DIY club, cookery club, art group, computer group, photography group, dance lessons, guitar lessons, craft workshops.

There are many great ideas in there and the committee would be delighted to hear from anyone wishing to set up a new group/club, or organise a one-off event, to complement the existing options. Hall availability

Whilst the hall is well utilised the committee are keen to encourage further use both to widen choice, supporting our objective to improve the conditions of life for local residents, and also to generate revenue to help cover the costs of the hall. In support of this, hall bookings now have flexible start times with sessions of 2-6 hours (subject to availability). At the time of writing there are a number of potential regular slots: 2nd Mon evening in the month, Tues evening (after 1930, but not 3rd), Tue/Thu/Fri mornings and Mon-Fri afternoons (except 2nd / 4th Thu).

Hall extension

A variety of comments were received regarding the possible extension of the hall to provide additional capacity and facilities. The committee is investigating, but this is at an early stage and any proposal that emerges will depend on funding.

St Sampson Rises - a Celebration

St Sampson's Church, South Hill, is halfway to raising the £600K needed for its Herculean restoration project to make the church sustainable for the 21st century and beyond by restoring the unique heritage, increasing community use and growing the congregation.

Our celebration day, on Sunday 7th April started with a thanksgiving service at 11.15am lead by Archdeacon Kelly Betteridge, followed by lunch and an open afternoon at 1.30pm, with tours, talks and exhibits, highlighting the completed works. The day was a huge success. Nearly 80 people attended it was an awesome day, with conversations bouncing off the walls about all that had been achieved: the restoration of the stained glass windows; installation of mains water; a composting toilet in the churchyard; restoration of the Michael Hill monument; the removal of the bells for restoration; masonry repairs and door restoration.

We enjoyed delicious cream teas, and a celebration serpent cake symbolising St Sampson slaying the giant serpent, and a glass of bubbly.

Rt. Rev. Philip Mounstephen, Bishop of Winchester (former Bishop of Truro until Sept 2023) said

'I am delighted by what you've done at St Sampson's and am inspired by your energy, commitment and passion – it stands as such a wonderful example to others of just what is possible'.

The parishioners and community are determined that St Sampson's Church will be here for the next few hundred years.

May I say how impressive your commitment to transforming your church building is and I am glad to see that more is yet to come. It is always a pleasure to see the continued efforts and care put into church buildings and their continuing use as a space of worship. National Churches Trust

The St Sampson's Unlocked project started in 2019, with a big vision and a long list! Step by step the project is progressing and despite various setbacks the team continue with enthusiasm to keep moving forwards.

The Parochial Church Council recently received Church of England Faculty approval for the next phase of the project which includes: repairing the roof and ceiling, installing a kitchen and indoor WC facilities and creating a cosy meeting room with underfloor heating.

Celebrate Great British Beef Week

24th - 31st April

ONE-POT BEEF AND MOZZARELLA MEATBALLS WITH SPINACH AND TOMATO ORZO

Ingredients - Serves 4

For the meatballs

450g minced beef
60g breadcrumbs
25g Parmesan, grated
1 egg
2 cloves garlic, grated
1tbspn fresh oregano
125g mozzarella, torn into 24 pieces

200g baby spinach Fresh basil and parmesan to serve

For the orzo

1 onion, diced
2 cloves garlic, grated
200g orzo
1 x 400g can tomatoes
100ml red wine
500ml beef stock
2 sprigs rosemary and
3 sprigs thyme, both to be
removed before serving
1 tspn smoked paprika

Method

Preheat oven to 180°C fan/200°C/gas mark 6.

In a large bowl, mix together the minced beef, breadcrumbs, Parmesan, egg, garlic, oregano and seasoning. Take enough to form a golf ball-sized ball, flatten it in your hand, add a small piece of mozzarella and enclose it within the minced beef. Repeat until all the mixture is used. You will get about 20-24 meatballs.

Add a splash of olive oil to a large heaven-based ovenproof pan that has a lid, sear the meatballs all over to brown them, and then set them aside.

To the same pan, add the chopped onion, adding more olive oil if needed, and cook until translucent. Add the garlic, cook for a minute, and then pour in the orzo. Toast the orzo for a couple of minutes and then add the tomatoes, red wine and beef stock, herbs, paprika and seasoning. Return the meatballs to the pan, nestling them in the orzo, and then cover. Place in the preheated oven for about 30 minutes or until the orzo is cooked. Remove the lid, add the fresh spinach and replace the lid - the residual heat will wilt the spinach.

Stir the spinach through and serve with basil leaves and grated Parmesan.

As always, prospective members are very welcome to come along to a couple of meetings with no commitment.





CHURCH MATTERS

Last month in "Church Matters" Roy Cooper asked whether the church really matters today. He concluded that "the church is central to the purposes of God and is of benefit to the world around us"

That set me thinking about what that means in a practical, every day sense for the communities around the churches in our area – especially to those who do not attend church. Do our churches matter to anyone other than those of us who attend them or love them as heritage buildings? Do we follow St Paul's request to share with those who are in need and practise hospitalityⁱ?

If you have visited the Eden Project you will probably remember the "Plant Takeaway" exhibit at the entrance, where everything which relies on plants disappears, one by one. (Children usually call it the "dead cat exhibition"). I remembered the Plant Takeaway when I began thinking about what our churches do in the local community and in the wider world. Are there things which matter to our communities and what would happen if they disappeared?

There are many things run by volunteers from the Callington cluster churches, such as Toddler Groups, 'Drop In' cafes, 'Warm Spaces', Soup Lunches, the Food Bank, etc. Do they matter? I am sure they do.

For example, toddler groups, are not "just" toddler groups – they provide a lifeline for new parents who may be struggling in a world where health visitors can no longer visit regularly, and they play a vital part in preparing children for independence and school. In the words of a recent report "Beneath the surface of our noisy, messy, and chaotic sessions there is all sorts of hidden treasure. Children are learning how to interact with others, developing communication skills, gaining resilience, growing in curiosity and much more" https://notjustaparentandtoddler.group/

And all the toddler groups run by our churches are free.

The Foodbanks run by local churches in Callington are also completely free of charge to those who need them. They provide vital food and other supplies for desperate people, as well as a chance to chat with sympathetic listeners.



There are apparently more foodbanks in the UK than there are foodbank McDonalds" and almost every single one was set up by, linked to or run by, a church and its volunteers.



A report by the National Churches Trust, who provide funding to maintain and improve church buildings, has quantified the economic and social value to the UK linked to church buildings of all denominations. They found that, in 2021, the yearly value of the activities undertaken by volunteers from the nation's churches is around £55 billion That is roughly twice as much as the total spend on adult social care by local authorities.

I am not suggesting that things which matter are only organised by churches but many of them are. It would certainly matter to people if they were not there. From Food Banks to Toddler Groups, churches provide vital services to their local communities. Churches matter.

South Hill Parish Council meeting

Details of the meeting held on 16 April 2024 include the following topics:

SOUTH HILL PARISH HALL: A special pre-meeting was held in the hall to update council members about the planned hall extensions. Details were given of the main aims of the improvements: to provide Changing Room facilities, additional storage space, an additional meeting room, additional car parking, roof renovation and a lounge/social area. Monies will be sought to allow an architect to propose solutions.

PLANNNG APPLICATION PA24/01132: Tregonnett Farm – Creation of a reservoir lake. Around a dozen Parish members attended the meeting to make representations regarding this application. Of particular concern was the significant lorry activity associated with an earlier application made by the farm. It was stressed that the council could only comment on the details of this application and that the strength of opposition to any application should be expressed by public comments on the Cornwall Council Planning Portal. To this purpose those attending were advised to comment using the online method. It was also stated that the current work at Tregonnett Farm had caused considerable pollution in the Lynher causing concern for the Salmon hatchery downstream. The council in its comments to Cornwall Council will stress this concern.

LEGAL STANDING OF THE PARISH HALL: Mr Chris Beckett updated the parish council on plans to convert the Legal standing of the Parish Hall into a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). The Hall committee has been advised that this can be achieved by a one step process which will allow the Hall to act as a company but without some of the legal burdens. The transfer application was sent to the Charity Commission in January but response is not expected until May.

CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION PLAN: The Action Plan was reviewed and responsibility for initial actions in all the major areas of concern was allocated.

FOOTPATHS: A letter has been received by the Council from the owner of the Woodland House correcting an earlier impression that an agreement had been reached with Cornwall Council regarding placing of a gate and fence to allow access along Public Footpath 638/20/1 through Woodland House land. The Parish Council will continue to work with the Highways Department of Cornwall Council to allow access along this path.

Dear Editor

Like many others, we lost our internet last month when this accident happened. Apparently the cable which got cut wasn't properly secured to the pole. You can report damaged equipment to Openreach here but generally they aren't interested unless it is dangerous. Openreach have a policy of reactive maintenance so things get fixed after the problem has occurred whereas most of us would choose to prevent a problem before something goes wrong. We were a bit slow reporting our loss of internet to our Internet Service Provider. We assumed that because others had already reported the fault, ours would get fixed too. We would have got our service restored quicker if we had reported it sooner. From the moment we reported it, our Internet Service Provider, Zen Internet were on the case. They immediately accessed the Openreach information about the fault. For the next few days, they phoned us to keep us updated on the progress of the repair. They also booked an Openreach engineer to visit our home to change the ONT box which had expired. The final call from Zen was after it was fixed in order to check that everything was working properly and that we were satisfied.

We did get some compensation. I don't know if that is a standard payment or is set differently by each ISP. We were not offered an alternative way of connecting to the internet so made do with our phones. It made us realise how dependent we have become on our computers and good, reliable internet access. If we were renewing our broadband contract we would ask about back up systems. As things stand, we are satisfied with Zen, their customer service and value for money.

Fibre Broadband arrives in Berrio, Egypt and Trewoodloe and Tregonnett.

Meanwhile, elsewhere in the parish lots of homes have recently got fibre broadband for the first time. It's so easy to take a good, fast and reliable internet connection for granted, when you have it but some parts of South Hill parish have had to put up with a poor internet service via their copper telephone wires until this year. This part of the parish and some homes on the other side of the Lynher are served by cables from the telephone exchange at the top of Longridge Road. Openreach have had it in mind to get this done for years but then found no end of reasons for not doing it. That was until Ivan Callanan got involved!

Ivan soon found out how to get Openreach to take some action, then became Project Leader for an Ultrafast Fibre Community Project. This was fully funded by the Government's Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme. That's involved everyone who has now benefitted, working together, committing to the project and then applying for the vouchers. Superfast Cornwall (part of Cornwall Council) helped too by committing to fund the project if there was a shortfall. They also helped by getting our project over the line when the Voucher Scheme ended part way through the project. Thank you Julian if you happen to read this!

Most people are either just using a mobile phone and not bothering with a telephone land line or have switched to a VOIP service (Voice Over Internet Protocol) Everyone has been able to keep their old 01579 number despite being told by some providers that this was impossible. The project should have been completed at the end of January but due to some unnecessary delays, the final couple of homes were connected just a few days ago. Thanks to everyone involved for the part they played in getting this project funded and completed. Thank you in particular to Ivan for his sheer dogged determination to see this project through.
