#### Recipe & Method

1. Into a large saucepan add 4oz margarine or butter, 6oz caster sugar, 6oz currants, 6oz sultanas, 2oz mixed peel, 8 fl oz water, 1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, 1 heaped teaspoon

mixed spice; bring to a rolling boil and cook for 1 minute. 2. Cool the mixture for 15 minutes, stirring often, before gradually adding 2 large beaten eggs followed by 4oz plain flour, 4oz self-raising flour & a pinch of salt.

3. Stir well then turn into a greased & lined 2lb loaf-tin. Bake in the oven for 1 hr 15 minutes at 140°C.





St Sampson's continued:

Our next event is a **Cream Tea and Callington Town Band on Saturday September 21<sup>st</sup>** Put the date on your calendar, time to be confirmed.

#### July 28<sup>th</sup> is St Sampson's Day

Celebrations start 10am with coffee and a service, followed by a bring and share lunch, finger foods please. Come for the morning or just for lunch, and find out who St Sampson was.

Of all the 'Cornish' saints, Sampson is the only one for whom there appears to be documentary evidence written both at the time he was alive and less than two hundred years after his death. Most saints' lives weren't written until over five hundred years after they died. So the little information we have about Sampson is probably more reliable than that for most saints, including St Piran or St Petroc!

**Sampson was the son of a noble family from South Wales, born in the early 500s**. He was educated in a monastery at Llantwit Major where he eventually became ordained. Sampson was regarded as a very holy and special person from an early age and is said to have performed various miracles. He travelled for a while as a missionary in Ireland and on his return to

Wales lived as a hermit before becoming Abbot of the monastery at Llantwit Major.

After some years as Abbot, Sampson experienced a vision in which God called him to travel as a missionary to Europe. At that time, the normal way to get to Europe from Wales was to travel by sea to north Cornwall, cross Cornwall and then sail to Brittany from somewhere like the Fowey estuary. Sampson therefore set out by boat with his father and others and is believed to have landed somewhere along the Camel estuary.

He visited a monastery called Docco, which existed at the time at St Kew, but the local monks refused to let him stay with them, because his standards were too high for their Cornish way of life! Sampson and his party then travelled east. They came across a group of people involved in games around a stone pillar or image of an idol.

During the games, a young man fell from his horse and appeared to have been killed but Sampson healed him. As a result, the leader of the people, named Vedianus asked Sampson to baptise them all.

The story goes that Vedianus asked Sampson's help with a huge serpent which was living in a nearby cave and terrorising the neighbourhood. Sampson of course managed to kill the serpent and subsequently went to live in the cave where a spring of water gushed out in response to his prayers. He founded a monastery nearby, to be run by his father, Amon, and his cousin Henoc.

Sampson himself moved on through Cornwall and sailed to Brittany where he founded another monastery at Dol and remained there until his death in the late 570s or early 580s, allegedly on 28<sup>th</sup> July, which is why we celebrate him on that date.

Whatever the truth of the stories about Sampson, he appears to have existed and to have spent a short time in Cornwall, almost certainly founding at least one monastery here.

Archaeological evidence has shown that the site of St Sampson's church has been a place of Christian worship since before the 1100s and probably earlier. The presence of the very rare sixth century Christian memorial stone (which now stands at the entrance to the churchyard) means that there must have been Christians here at around the time of St Sampson and gives weight to the argument that South Hill may have been the place where he converted local people to Christianity and founded a monastery.

## **RUNNER BEAN BRUNCH**

Serves 4

2 eggs

500g runner beans, sliced 85g good white breadcrumbs 1 clove garlic, whole Small bunch chives, snipped 4 rashers bacon, cooked

Dressing

4 tblsp olive or sunflower oil

1 tblsp extra virgin olive oil

1 tsp English mustard (or half tsp mustard powder)


Cook the runner beans in water, and hard boil the eggs. Whisk the dressing ingredients together and add seasoning.

Heat frying pan (use the one that the bacon was cooked in), add a little extra oil and add breadcrumbs and garlic clove.

Stir for about 3 minutes until toasty and golden and just infused with garlic. Remove the garlic clove.

Chop the eggs, chives and bacon and mix together.

Toss the beans with the dressing while still warm, then put in a serving dish. Top with the egg, bacon and breadcrumbs.

Since the new waste collection service has been introduced, Cornwall council tell me...

We have collected over 3,000 tonnes of food waste so far and kerbside recycling in South East Cornwall has gone from **36% to 58%.**





The council works with housing providers to offer grants and initiatives(External link) to improve homes to make them more energy efficient and help them become cheaper to run. Grant funding is not always available to everyone and with limited budgets the council can't pay for improvements to everyone's home. So, are looking at the best ways to support homeowners to help themselves to make improvements. A main theme of the strategy is that no one is left behind, so we are looking at practical ways to support all of our residents.

A "Thriving and Sustainable Cornwall" is a Council priority and the <u>Housing Strategy 2030(External link)</u>, aims for every resident have access to a safe, warm, and secure home.

## **Decarbonising Homes - A Draft Strategy for Cornwall**

The draft strategy looks at how to improve energy efficiency and cut emissions in our homes. We have a legal duty to decarbonise as set out in the Climate Change Act 2008 (legislation.gov.uk(External link)). The Climate Change Action Plan 2019(External link), included a Carbon Neutral Homes Programme setting out the Council's aim to move faster and A Climate Emergency DPD(External link), was adopted in February 2023 introducing new, supportive planning policies. This draft strategy will be key to delivering on these aims.

Homes in Cornwall contribute over 20% of total emissions. We know that over 90% of them will need some form of retrofitting to meet our carbon neutral ambitions.

As the draft strategy has developed it confirmed the need to find a solution for all. We must ensure that no one is left behind and that positive health and long-term financial benefits are for everyone. To do this we must be able to offer the right advice and guidance to build trust in retrofit suppliers and technology. Helping residents to help themselves, will support growth in the green economy by and improving skills, training and employment we can help close supply chain gaps and attract new suppliers to Cornwall.

We invite you to review the draft Housing Decarbonisation strategy. It suggests short, medium and long-term actions and sets out our key principles, targets and a 'road map'. This will help us plan and progress housing decarbonisation measures in Cornwall.

Following a discussion and the lack of contact from parishioners (only three attending the Annual Parish meeting) the council looked at the work required and agreed that owing to lack of interest, their insufficient resources and funding it was not viable for the parish council to be involved, and no further action was to be taken on this matter. Proposed by Cllr Smith, seconded by Cllr Tunnicliffe and agreed by everyone except Cllr Skelton who supported the concept of building affordable housing with the parish council being involved.

#### Gardens of Mercy . UPDATE.

On July 2<sup>nd</sup> members of the **Gardens of Mercy** charity came to the hall at Golberdon to present an outline for a Muslim burial ground in fields at Maders. Many had come to ask questions and the hall was full with many standing. Cllr. Phil Seeva chaired the meeting. GoM members said they would keep us updated and sent this message for The Connection newsletter.

The only relevant report we have at present is the **ecological survey** and **biodiversity net gain report**.

Another important report which we have requested is a 'Tier 1 risk assessment report for new cemeteries'. They will also

be reporting on mining on the site, I will forward a copy of their report as soon as we get it.

We will contact the **Highways Agency shortly for their assessment**, which is a mandatory requirement for planning approval.

The **groundwater report** will be downloaded from the DEFRA interactive map and information on sites of **archaeological importance** will be downloaded from Cornwall Council's interactive map.

No issues of concern have been highlighted on either of the interactive maps and both are accessible online to the public.


Other reports will be acquired if requested by the council following submission of the planning application.

### **Church Matters**

As I write, the news is still focussed on the general election outcome. In the coming weeks and months the promise is for change. A change in policies that the new government believes will begin to address the many issues that face our nation and ultimately affect each one of us. There is also a stated commitment to restore confidence in politicians and to put service to the nation before party politics. It is sad that the latter needs saying.

At the core of an appointment to any public office is service, service to the community, service to the constituency, service to the nation.



**Service**, however, is not limited to those in public office. It is an attitude of mind that is of value in all walks of life. I worked for many years in the biotech and pharmaceuticals industries, mainly supporting research and production with computer and instrumentation systems. I was fortunate (as a Christian I would say blessed) to work for organisations with a strong service mentality. They understood that good service contributes significantly to success and prosperity.

There are many in our local communities who are employed in sectors that offer a service locally or further afield. In fact, I suggest that most employment is ultimately to serve others – from farmers to doctors and nurses, computer repairs to builders, car maintenance to shops and pubs. I'm sure we have all come across those who just do the job and others who provide a service, sometimes beyond what has been contracted. I know who I would prefer to deal with!

In addition to paid work, either as an employee or self-employed, there are many in our communities who carry out voluntary service, often the retired. It may be collecting for Ukraine, supporting Foodbanks, serving our local schools as governors or members of the PTFA or simply keeping an eye on an elderly or unwell neighbour

**Service** is a core value of the Christian church although, sadly, it is not always lived out as well as it should be. At supper one evening Jesus washed his disciple's feet – at the time traditionally the task of a menial servant. He used the occasion to illustrate to them that serving others was a fundamental aspect of their calling as his disciples. Throughout history and right up to the present time this principle of serving others has been understood and practiced by those of faith and no faith alike but so often pioneered by followers of Jesus. Many of the benefits we now take for granted have their roots in this principle of serving others. Among them are the provision of education and medical treatment for all and more recently Foodbanks and Christians against Poverty (CAP)

There are many pressing issues facing our nation that politicians alone cannot address. Each of us can play a part in beginning to deal with some of them. So often that process starts by resolving to serve others whenever we are able. Brian Norris





A warning has been issued by the **World Health Organisation** to those planning summer holidays, urging them to take Covid precautions - including getting vaccinated, wearing masks and testing.

The WHO reminded everyone that the pandemic is far from over, with the virus still claiming **1,700 lives** globally every week, and significant outbreaks ongoing in popular holiday destinations.

The WHO director-general, expressed concern over the declining vaccine coverage among the over-60s and health workers, two groups most vulnerable to severe Covid outcomes. In response to the ongoing threat, some UK hospitals have reinstated mandatory mask-wearing, while others are requesting individuals with Covid symptoms, who don't require medical attention, to stay home. Over in France, the Tour de France has enforced mask-wearing for anyone interacting with competitors or teams following several Covid cases.
