Work to upgrade the A38 Saltash Tunnel has been delayed until next year. National Highways was due to start an extensive programme of work to update the technology in the tunnel in November but it has now said the roadworks have been rescheduled for Summer 2025.

As part of a 'generational' refurbishment project, the tunnel and traffic control system within the 36-year-old tunnel will be upgraded, including electrical distribution, new LED lighting, fans and electronic signage. The upgrade represents a £25 million investment from the highways agency to improve journeys and maintain the safe operation of the tunnel for the future. <u>Major A38 Saltash Tunnel works delayed</u> <u>until next year - Plymouth Live</u>


Following our first meeting to discuss ideas for the event we have a list of helpers and need many more.


It promises to be an interesting and informative evening. Refreshments will be available.

## South Hill Remembers Them

The names of those on our war memorial

**Private John Garfield Doney** Aged 21 The London Regiment. Son of William & Martha Doney, Wagmuggle. <u>Read more</u>

**Private Thomas Drew** Aged 29 The Somerset Light Infantry Son of Mr & Mrs William Drew from Pensilva <u>Read more</u>

**Private Percy Jenkin** Aged 22 The Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry. Before enlisting, he lived at Manaton where he worked as a waggoner. <u>Read more</u>

**Private William Gordon Landry** Aged 24 The Essex Regiment Son of William & Elizabeth Landry, Trevigro. <u>Read more</u>

**2nd Lieutenant Herbert Gloyne Forster-Morris** Aged 19 The South Wales Borderers Only son of the Reverend Herbert & Mrs Forster-Morris, the Rector of South Hill. <u>Read more</u>

**Private William Nicholas Stephens** Aged 28 The Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry. Son of Stephen & Harriet Stephens, of Pear Tree Row, Callington. <u>Read more</u>

**Sapper Vernon William Buckingham** Aged 21 The Royal Engineers Uncle of Jill Reynolds & Shirley Shears. <u>Read</u> <u>more.</u>

Also remembered from this parish, but not named on the war memorial.

**Able Seaman Stanley Jenkin**, brother of Percy. Aged 18 Lived at Trewassick where he looked after the cattle. <u>Read more</u> also

**Chief Petty Officer John Henry Dennis** Chief Stoker aboard HMS Earnest. Drowned aged 39 <u>Read more</u> and **Petty Officer Aaron Rogers** on HMS Vivid died aged 40, awarded the Distinguished Service Medal for his part in the battle at Gallipoli. Both are buried in South Hill churchyard. Their graves can be found next to each other in the row of graves nearest to the road wall. <u>Read more</u>

Also remember not previously listed: **Private Herbert Dawe** <u>Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry</u> died aged 23 in France, son of Richard and Hannah of Trewoodloe <u>Read more</u>

Plus on 2nd April 1826 a baby by the name of **George Symons** was baptised in the font at St. Sampson's. At the age of 30 he was one of the first people to be awarded the Victoria Cross for 'conspicuous gallantry under terrific fire' during the Crimean war.

The headphones came into their own as the environment was very noisy. It was a rather hot atmosphere and as we were all wearing 2 hi viz vests and a white coat it got a little warm!

Dark winter nights approaching - time to make puddings! **Chocolate Puddle Pudding** During the cooking the water sinks through the pudding, making a thick chocolate sauce underneath 😳

Oven temperature 180°C, 350°F. Serves 4 - 5

#### Pudding

100g (4oz) self raising flour 100g (4oz) soft margarine 100g (4oz) dark brown sugar 30ml (2tbsp) cocoa

#### Sauce

45ml (3tbsp) dark brown sugar 45ml (3 tbsp) cocoa 375ml (3/4 pint) boiling water Demerara sugar for topping

2 eggs

Beat all the pudding ingredients together until smooth and glossy. Place in a greased 1 litre (2 pint) ovenproof dish, and level with the back of a spoon.

For the sauce, blend the sugar and cocoa with fingertips and sprinkle over the pudding mixture. Gently pour on the boiling water in a circular movement. Place the dish on a baking sheet in the oven for 35-40 minutes. Sprinkle with Demerara sugar and serve immediately.

The site is next to the naval dockyard and provides heat and steam to the buildings and ships in port. Bottom ash is transported to Exeter, otherwise the facility is similar in ways to the SUEZ plant at St Dennis. Paul is also Chairman of the **Callington Youth Project Group** and the group decided to donate **£250** from our Recycling for Charity funds to help with their running costs.


You may have noticed, if you've visited. THE BELL at the entrance, the plague says REDIVIVUS (Latin for reborn)

Over a period of NINE months, waste aluminium was collected from the bottom ash of the Devonport CHP facility, this was metal that should have been recycled. It was cast as a working bell at the world renown John Taylor's & Co bell foundry. Before mass communication bells were widely used as a call to action, a marker of the time, to call communities together, and to commemorate important events.

Born of the discarded materials of our everyday lives the bell represents and marks a change in thinking as we look forward to a better, more sustainable future.


Dated 2016 the bell weighs 4 tonnes.

#### Details of the council meeting held on 15 October 2024 include the following topics:

**CORNWALL COUNCIL COMMUNITY CHEST (CCCC):** The public are reminded that CCCC monies detailed in September's Connection (£3500) is available to all not-for-profit groups in Cornwall. Grants cover a wide range of activities, with guidance for applicants and other details at <u>www.cornwall.gov.uk/cornwall-council-community-chest/</u>. The closing date for applications is 14 February 2025. **2024/25 BUDGET:** Details of the current budget were examined with the current year's finances deemed to be on target.

**ILLEGAL PARKING:** A Camper Van has been parked for about a week in a layby between Trevigro and Golberdon. The council will contact Cornwall Highways if this persists. Members of the public are encouraged to do so also if they consider this to be a nuisance.

**PARKING IN THE RECREATION FIELD:** The need for an additional parking area has long been recognised. The Parish Council will detail plans to improve the available parking at the Trevigro end of the field over the next month or so.

**RECENT FLOODING OF LOCAL ROADS:** The public are reminded that flooding incidences should be processed through Cornwall Highways; if a safety issue, by calling 0300 1234 222 or if reporting small areas of flooding to Cornwall Council.

**FOOTPATHS:** A gate and posts have been delivered to the council for fitting on the Woodlands path, this will be done over the next month. Subsequent to this, a request for the required length of fencing to complete the fitting will be made to the Cormac Senior Countryside Officer. A replacement Footpath sign has been fitted opposite Trenavin Nursery indicating the direction of the path to Penwarden. The sign to Penwarden at the crossing Woodcockwells road does seem to be OK. The stiles on the footpath from Mornick to Trewassick will be looked at and repaired over the next couple of months.
