German Shepherd Rescue Elite, GSRE, was established by Allison Clarke and myself Lizzy Brown, to help **unwanted**, **abandoned and neglected German Shepherds** and just as importantly, offer education to the public on the responsibilities and pros and cons of owning a large working breed dog.

We rely totally on donations, grants and fundraising events to fund the work we do and could not operate without the fantastic team of dedicated volunteers, which is now 600 strong, across the country. At present we have about 40 dogs in commercial kennels, 40 in our kennels in Cornwall and 50 in foster. You can imagine **the bills for kennels and veterinary treatment are vast every month.**

The charity was very fortunate to be in a position to purchase **Camelot Kennels in July 2023**, and it is now the home of GSRE. We were very fortunate to have Dave Wardell and family join us to run the kennels and look after the dogs in our care. Camelot has also built up a strong team of local volunteers, and we also have students from the Duchy College attend for work experience.

The majority of dogs come into our care from the council kennels where they have been abandoned by their uncaring and unscrupulous owners, having just 7 days before they can be put to sleep. Some pounds will endeavour to find the dogs a home or rescue space, **but the reality is that many healthy dogs with no behavioural issues are killed every week simply because they are surplus to requirements**. We believe every dog deserves a second chance.

Our volunteers are our biggest asset and without their dedication, commitment, and support, GSRE would not be able to help as many dogs as it does. Every volunteer's input makes a difference to a dog out there one way or another.





PHEASANT WITH PLUMS

Quick to prepare, and very delicious!
Ingredients:
1 pheasant
1lb of plums
Sea salt (Cornish, of course!)
Crème Fraiche

Method

- 1 Wash the pheasant and wipe dry
- 2 Put into a pan with the plums, sprinkle with salt, and heat gently
- 3 DON'T ADD ANY WATER!
- 4 Cover the pan and cook very slowly until the pheasant is tender
- 5 Remove and de-bone the pheasant
- 6 Remove the plum stones
- 7 Return the pheasant meat to the pan, add some crème fraiche and gently re-heat before serving

Once again our Carols by Candlelight was enjoyed by many and as always was a highlight of the year, singing carols and enjoying mulled wine.

Sampson's Supertots saw 23 children at their Christmas visit with singing, hearing the Christmas

story and a visit from Santa.

We had a wonderful river baptism in the Lynher. It wasn't cold at all! Honest!





In December our gutters and drains on the north side were renewed and restored by Ash Lamb and his team from Marlam Construction. We aim to get the south side completed in 2025. The internal tower doors were removed for restoration and will come back looking glorious in the new year and the tomb recess in the chancel is scheduled for repair in May.

More urgent, very much more urgent, is the roof! Ash has repaired and replaced many slipped slates and the condition is dire. We have had a big puddle in the Manaton Chapel! Temporarily fixed and we aim to get the Manaton Chapel roof replaced in March, quotes and funds permitting, but all the roof needs urgent attention. We will be applying for Heritage lottery funding ASAP and fervently hope they will award us a sizable amount of funding.

In February we aim to continue the bell restoration campaign to raise the rest of the funds to have our bells restored and back and ringing out. The five historic bells have not been heard and fully

rung for over 50 years, due to the condition of the tower and their dangerous and derelict state.

The listed bells, four dating from 1698 and the newest and biggest (weighing around 8 hundredweight and measuring 36 inches in diameter) from 1831, have been dismantled and taken down from the tower and taken to the Taylor Bell Foundry in Loughborough. Bell hanger Andrew Ogden said: "These are some of the oldest bells I have worked on and I look forward to re hanging them". Please donate here > StSampsonsChurchbells



South Hill Parish Council

Details of the council meeting held on 17th **December 2024 include the following topics:** The meeting started with the open public session. The Lead Parish Hall Trustee for the proposed new hall extension, Kim Howat spoke. The hall committee are about to submit a planning application for the Parish Hall extension. The proposal will have a requirement for additional parking which will require a separate application. The Council agreed, in principle, to support this. You can contact Kim on w.howat1@btinternet.com There were no other planning matters.

Councillor Phil Seeva, our acting representative on Cornwall Council, reported on the pressure from our Government to grant permission to build more housing. However, the barrier to more homes is not Cornwall Council. It's developers that nationally have permission to build over one million homes that have not been built yet.

It's been reported in the press that Treveth (Cornwall Council's housing developer) has gone bust. It hasn't. The main objective of Treveth was to provide good quality social housing for residents of Cornwall, which it's doing. It's not scheduled to make a profit until 2036.

Accounts:

The Council's budget for the next financial year was approved. It was agreed that the precept would need to rise from £11K to £12K to cover anticipated increases in costs and a small reserve for future projects.

The Council has received a £14K invoice from Openreach in connection with the fibre broadband project to Berrio, Egypt and Trewoodloe. This should be covered by a grant from Superfast Cornwall, the terms of the grant, require our Council to pay the invoice before claiming the grant and the grant offer ends at the end of this month.

Update: Since the PC meeting, Cornwall Council have agreed to extend the Superfast Cornwall grant into the new year which will also give the Parish Council time to request a detailed invoice from Openreach.

Footpaths: Quotations for trimming the footpaths were received and the cheaper quote was accepted. The recently installed new gate at Woodland House will need to be moved as it is obstructing access to the adjoining field. The farmer has kindly agreed to assist.

Correspondence: Most communications from Cornwall Council are classified as Controlled. This means that these documents must be distributed or published in full with no editing. The public can request any documents here. Documents classified as Confidential are for internal use only.

Community Area Partnership report:

The A30 Plusha junction has been closed to traffic turning east from the A3257 and a 50mph speed limit imposed as a result of the third fatal accident in 6 months. Cornwall Councillors have met with National Highways but there is no money for major changes to the junction so the cones will be there for 18 months and probably much longer.

A388 Road Safety Campaign

Cornwall Council is launching a campaign to remind road users of the dangers on this notoriously dangerous stretch of road. The Parish Council was invited to contribute to the campaign.
