

Community Energy Group supporting Sustainability & Renewable Energy

As reported in the last **SHARE** email, an **EnergyLocal Club** could directly help you, our members by lowering your electricity bills by selling you directly, cheaper renewable energy, generated locally. Another bonus is that prices won't be affected by events in the Middle East. **SHARE** has contacted EnergyLocal to find out more about the feasibility of a Club in our area. Meanwhile, the government and Great British Energy have announced the Local Power Plan. As well as direct support for renewable energy projects on public buildings such as Solar PV for the Callington Health Centre building, the Plan supports the concept of generating, storing and using energy locally. **SHARE** has submitted an Expression of Interest to find out more about how Great British Energy might provide the infrastructure (data collection from meters, club member billing, etc.) which would make a local energy club work.

We had hoped to give you more details at the Love your Home Part Two event planned for 4th April. It now seems unlikely we will be able to do that so this event is being postponed until later in the year.

St. Sampsons Church has been all over the news...

has appeared in over 30 papers and publications with 2 TV appearances and 1 radio clip. Celebrating the return and installation of the tower bells which date from 1698, this was a truly historic event. The 5 bells have these inscriptions.

- When I you call then follow me all (the smallest bell 27" weighing 3 ¼ cwt)
- Adam Grills Warden – John Luggar (28" bell weighing 3 ¾ cwt)
- George Matthew – Stephen Trehane – John Welke (29" bell weighing 4 cwt)
- Samson Grills – Adam ChWarden – Will Dicken (33" bell weighing 5 ¾ cwt)
- Revd. E Budge – James Sowden Warden (the tenor bell , 36" diameter and weighing 7 ½ cwt – it only just fitted down the tower when the bells were removed).

Golberdon Housing project

On 17th February, the Golberdon Housing Working Party (GHWP), made up of local residents, requested support from the Parish Council with an application to Cornwall Council for Early Stage Feasibility Bridging Funds. This has arisen after the group became aware that Cornwall Council were planning to sell the land behind Moorland View in Golberdon. The GHWP have been given the opportunity by Cornwall Council Affordable Housing staff to explore the possibility/feasibility of the site being used for affordable housing to meet local identified housing needs. The GHWP believe this to be in preference to the land being sold to the highest bidder and having no influence whatsoever on the outcome for the plot.

The GHWP's intention at this stage is to use the funding to set up a properly constituted group, necessary to access further funding at a later stage. The primary aim is to support those families impacted by the consequences of any future development, and to assess the opportunity of meeting local affordable housing needs. Access to this funding, it is hoped, will enable the group to start to explore options and potentially influence outcomes for the land.
