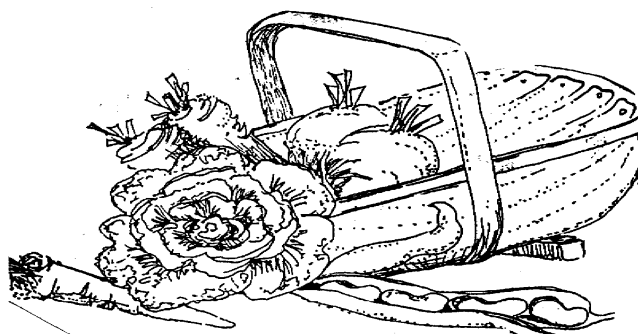


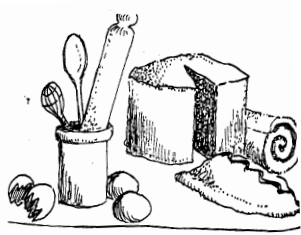

RULES OF THE SHOW

1. Entry fees for **classes are 10p. Children's classes (90 – 105) 5p.**
2. Entry forms and fees should be sent to the Secretary together with all cups won in 2025 **no later than Monday 10th August**
3. Entries can be submitted at the Hall on **Monday 10th from 6.30 -7.30pm.**
4. Entries can be staged on the day of the Show **from 8 -10am** or the previous evening **Friday 14th August from 7-8pm.**
5. All exhibits are left at the owners risk, and while every care is taken, the Show Committee will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or accident.
6. All entries (except in floral art classes) must be made or grown by the exhibitor. No joint entries.
7. Only one entry in any class will be accepted from any exhibitor. Exhibitors should supply their own containers.
- 8. Judging will commence at 10.15am sharp.**
9. The judges decision is final.
10. **Prize money is for children classes ONLY (90-105)** and is to be collected from the trophy table between 2pm & 4pm.
Any not collected will be donated back to the show funds.
- 11. No entries should be removed until after the prize giving.**
12. All cups are perpetual and remain the property of the Show Committee. Recipients are responsible for their safety whilst in their possession.

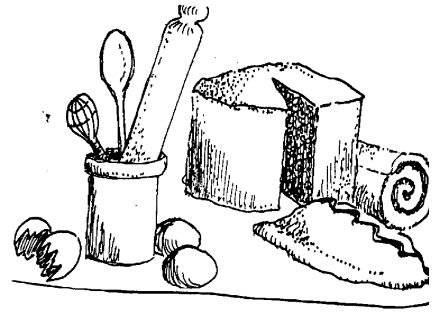

Recipe & Method

- 1. Into a large saucepan add 4oz margarine or butter, 6oz caster sugar, 6oz currants, 6oz sultanas, 2oz mixed peel, 8fl oz water, 1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, 1 heaped teaspoon mixed spice; bring to the boil and cook for 1 minute.*
- 2. Cool the mixture for 15 minutes, stirring often, before gradually adding 2 large beaten eggs followed by 4oz plain flour, 4oz self raising flour & a pinch of salt.*
- 3. Stir well then turn into a greased & lined 2lb loaf tin.*
- 4. Bake in the oven for 1hr 15 minutes at 140°C.*
